For in the Body of Christ we belong.


Love boldly, like the spirited colors of a rainbow,

LIGHTING OF THE LOVE CANDLE

When the people were looking for deliverance, the prophet Micah declared, "But you, O Bethlehem of Ephrathah...from you shall come forth for me one who is to rule in Israel, whose origin is from of old, from ancient day." (Micah 5:2). But what if Micah is also talking to us, proclaiming, "But you, O [fill in name of church or community], from you shall come forth for me..." What? What might God be calling forth from us?

God invites us to receive the promise of God's salvation and the sustenance of God's mercy and grace, enabling us to live the promise as God-bearers to the world. As Christ was born in Bethlehem, so too do we answer God's invitation to have Christ born among us today and every day.

Introduction to the Old Testament Lesson

Hannah, the mother of Samuel, prays a prayer of praise, not unlike Mary's song in our Gospel lesson.

Old Testament Lesson

1 Samuel 2:1-10

Then Hannah prayed: "My heart rejoices in the Lord! The Lord has made me strong. Now I have an answer for my enemies; I rejoice because you rescued me. 2 No one is holy like the Lord! There is no one besides you; there is no Rock like our God.3 "Stop acting so proud and haughty! Don't speak with such arrogance! For the Lord is a God who knows what you have done; he will judge your actions. The bow of the mighty is now broken, and those who stumbled are now strong. Those who were well fed are now starving, and those who were starving are now full. The childless woman now has seven children, and the woman with many children wastesaway. 6 The Lord gives both death and life; he brings some down to the grave but raises others up.⁷The Lord makes some poor and others rich; he brings some down and lifts others up.8 He lifts the poor from the dust and the needy from the garbage dump He sets them among princes, placing them in seats of honor. For all the earth is the Lord's, and he has set the world in order.9"He will protect his faithful ones, but the wicked will disappear in darkness. No one will succeed by strength alone.¹⁰ Those who fight against the Lord will be shattered. He thunders against them from heaven; the Lord judges throughout the earth. He gives power to his king; he increases the strength of his anointed one."

Introduction to the Gospel Lesson


Mary visits Elizabeth and the Holy Spirit is upon them both. Elizabeth proclaims the joy of Mary's pregnancy and Mary responds with a song.

Scripture Lesson Luke 1:39-55

A few days later Mary hurried to the hill country of Judea, to the town 40 where Zechariah lived. She entered the house and greeted Elizabeth. ⁴¹ At the sound of Mary's greeting, Elizabeth's child leaped within her, and Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit.⁴² Elizabeth gave a glad cry and exclaimed to Mary, "God has blessed you above all women, and your child is blessed. 43 Why am I so honored, that the mother of my Lord should visit me? 44 When I heard your greeting, the baby in my womb jumped for joy. 45 You are blessed because you believed that the Lord would do what he said."46 Mary responded, "Oh, how my soul praises the Lord.47 How my spirit rejoices in God my Savior!48 For he took notice of his lowly servant girl, and from now on all generations will call me blessed. 49 For the Mighty One is holy, and he has done great things for me.50 He shows mercy from generation to generation to all who fear him.51 His mighty arm has done tremendous things! He has scattered the proud and haughty ones.52 He has brought down princes from their thrones and exalted the humble. 53 He has filled the hungry with good things and sent the rich away with empty hands.⁵⁴ He has helped his servant Israel and remembered to be merciful.⁵⁵ For he made this promise to our ancestors, to Abraham and his children forever."




