Pastor's Page

Dear Friends,

As you may have noticed over the past several months, my column in this e-newsletter

contains stewardship conversations, devotions, and how we can look at stewardship more easily. Stewardship is how we take care of our church and its ministries. It is also the careful and responsible management of the resources entrusted to our church. It is a communal responsibility, and it is a personal one. When we speak of it, it is meant to strengthen us for the journey of life and the hope of our church's future.



The Bible has much to say about proper stewardship and how we look at it in relation to God and our lives together. 1 Timothy 6:17 shares this wisdom: "Command those who are rich in this world not to be arrogant nor to put their hope in wealth, which is so uncertain, but to put their hope in God, who richly provides us with everything for our enjoyment."

Today, let's look at how the author refers to wealth. He says we shouldn't put our hope in wealth - because it is uncertain. Has anyone noticed that wealth can be uncertain? One day, the stock market can be way up, and the next, it can be crashing. Has anyone here ever experienced a time when your 401k turned into a 201k - and then diminished all the way down to a

box of Special K?

Home values can skyrocket and then plummet. A new model or technology can reduce your once-valuable item to obsolescence! Indeed, the wealth of this world is uncertain. However, there is one thing - one Person to be more specific - that is completely certain: Our great God. Hebrews 13:8 shares this great news: "Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today, and forever."

When this world is uncertain, Jesus is there. When life shatters, Jesus is there. When things are wonderful, God is still present. God never changes—past, present, or future. That's a promise worth holding on to!

As we give to our church, may we know that we are sowing seed into God's Kingdom work, helping people hear and experience God's love and Good News in Christ Jesus. We do that when we find ways to help and love them, meet their needs, and share our hope that we can make a difference in this world. We also do it by investing in our spiritual growth and participating in a beautiful and meaningful worship service. In these ways, we lay up treasure in heaven that cannot fade away. Music Musings, by Dr. Elliot Jones

In July of 1717 King George I (who was from the same region in Germany as Handel) asked Handel to provide music for a concert on the River Thames. *Water Music* was performed by about fifty musicians on a barge, while the King and his entourage listened from another barge.

This painting, from over 100 years later, romanticizes this event by placing Handel on the same barge as the King! The *Water Music* is divided into three suites of five to seven movements each. I will play the first movement of the second suite, which is scored for alternating trumpets and French horns. Randy Triezenberg will sing the very dramatic aria "Rolling in foaming billows" from Haydn's *Creation*.



at pastorbo@pioneerucc.org and let him know of your interest and which time of day you can participate. Thanks!


